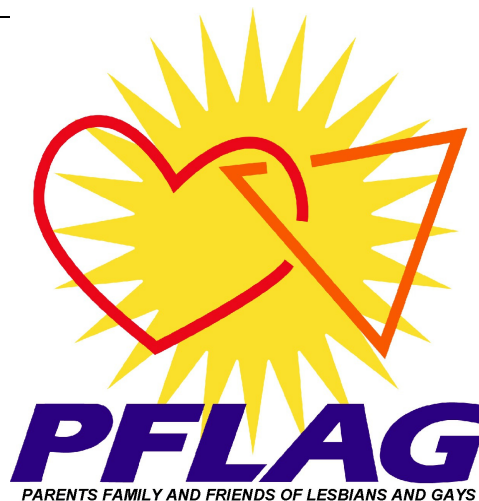

Our guest speaker for February's monthly meeting was James Van Abel, a facilitator from Briarpatch's Teens Like Us group. Teens Like Us has operated for 20+ years as an educational and support group for LGBTQ youth between the ages of 12-19. It offers a safe place for young people to be themselves, especially if they are the only out kid in their community which often can be unsafe. This is especially true for young people in rural areas of the state. The group also provides frank and honest discussions on such topics as safer sex for queer youth.

The group draws participants from many of the surrounding areas including Sun Prairie and Stoughton and as far away as Baraboo since these communities lack services for this population.

Teens Like Us is planning their Pride Prom which will be held at the Children's Museum (date to be determined). They are seeking cash donations and other items such as transitional gear (binders), wigs, prom clothing, and Uber gift cards.

Drive to ban library books with LGBTQ content erupts in Orange City (Iowa)

More than 300 people have signed a petition to either ban or label and group materials related to homosexual and transgender content in the Orange City Public Library.

Rev. Sacha Walicord of Grace Reformed Presbyterian Church rose before an overflow crowd of more than 100 at the Orange City Public Library Board of Trustees meeting Tuesday and said that LGBTQ books and other library content are “pushing an agenda” that is counter to those in the faith community.

“We won’t roll over,” he said. “We will stand up and we will fight.”

Others defended the selections, saying that a library is a place of diverse ideas and that library patrons are free to choose what to view or ignore.
